

SERMON NOTES We Are A People - The Presence of God Pt. 3 Chris Jolly // 10-23-23

Main Theme(s):

The presence of God is the cure and healing for all people, for every kinds of persons; the introvert the extrovert, the poor the rich, the strong the weak, the young and the old, the thinker, the feeler... Every kind of person everywhere finds the fullness of their life and identity in the presence of God.

The presence of God is the beginning of the story – He made us to have fellowship with Him, to be with Him. The presence of God is the hope in the failing of the story – He has not left or forsaken us. The rescue throughout the story – by His presence and power, He has delivered us, and His presence is the fullness and completion of the story (that He might fill all things – Ephesians 4:10). And His presence is the beginning of a new story. Revelation 21:1-4

Every person everywhere has a heart desiring, a soul longing, a mind inquiring to sing "better is one day in your courts" to exalt "I have no good a part from you" to utter "you are My shepherd, I lack nothing" to say "I will fear no evil, for You are with me."

Our heavenly Father desires to dwell with us, He desires for us to be in His presence, He so greatly desired and so greatly loved that He pursued us and made a way for us to have fellowship with Him. This has been His desire from the beginning.

Asking and Seeking

Psalm 27:4 - One thing I have asked from the LORD and that I shall seek. (Ask and seek).
